

Volunteer – Education Events

The South Downs National Park Authority (SDNPA) hosts and attends many educational events, including general and green careers fairs as well as information sessions throughout the year to celebrate and promote the National Park. Our attendance at events is one of the main ways we engage with young people about the amazing landscape, wildlife and opportunities within the park.

Some of the events take place outside of the park including urban fringe events and University and College campuses.

This is a great opportunity for anyone that enjoys meeting and chatting with new people, has a passion for the environment, the National Park or engaging with young people.

Volunteers are key ambassadors and play an important role in supporting the SDNPA in fulfilling our purposes 1: To conserve and enhance the natural beauty, wildlife and cultural heritage of the area.

Purpose 2: To promote opportunities for the understanding and enjoyment of the special qualities of the National Park by the public.

The SDNPA is an inclusive organisation and we welcome applications from everyone irrespective of sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, ethnicity, faith and religion, disability and age.

Compulsory Training:

Preferred/Est. Hours:

This is a flexible, unfixed volunteer role with opportunities available as and when events are planned. Events can last for several hours and some can be held in remote locations.

Role Description:

- Support the delivery of education events, including setting up and attending stalls, talking to young people, answering questions, handing out leaflets and other event specific tasks
- Act as an ambassador to promote the South Downs National Park, its work and purposes



Key Skills:

- Outgoing and friendly, happy to start conversations with young people
- Ability to treat everyone with dignity and respect, including other volunteers, SDNPA staff and members of the public
- Ability to communicate knowledge and information to a diverse range of people
- Willingness to work with/support staff and volunteers as part of a team
- Specialist skills in educating others on subjects such as natural, cultural or local history are welcomed

Key qualities: Friendly, reliable and self-sufficient, willing to accept direction/guidance
