

Just after the railway bridge, there is some excellent open access chalk downland, Chalton Down. It can be seen from the side of the road, beyond the main railway line. Rights of way access can be found along the roadside – one just before the railway bridge, the other on the road at the chicane.

At Old Idsworth to your left you will see St Huberts, also known as 'The Little Church in a Field'. This church contains some of the oldest wall paintings in southern England, dated c.1330, and the only known one of St Hubert. It is also the site of a deserted medieval village. Route Instructions Exit the train station and turn left heading down Finchdean road.

 2 Turn left onto Dean Lane just before Finchdean Road bears sharply to the right.
3 Opposite The George Inn in Finchdean take the left hand turning onto Ashcroft

4 Bear right onto South Lane and continue along the road until you reach Chalton.

 After The Red Lion pub take the right hand turn.
At the bottom of the hill cross over the railway line and bear round to the right.
Continue along the road, through Old Idsworth, until you enter back into Finchdean this time with The George Inn on your left.
Keep left where the road forks, then turn right at the t-junction back onto

9 Retrace the start of your ride back to Rowlands Castle train station.

# Cycle rides near Petersfield and Rowlands Castle



Leave your car at home, take the train



#### **Route Instructions**



This route is signposted by this distinctive sign

Turn left out of Petersfield railway station into Station Road and cross the level crossing, continuing to the roundabout.

(Alternative route, not signposted, for riders of road/electric bikes: from railway station turn right into Station Road. Turn left into Tilmore Road and continue over railway bridge to rejoin main route at point 4. More suitable in winter.)

2 At the roundabout turn right towards Steep and Alresford.

**3** Fifty yards after the roundabout cross to the track opposite.

4 Continue across the junction of tracks then turn left where the track meets Tilmore Road.

**5** Bear left down Harrow Lane, marked 'Dead End' then take the bridleway bridge over the A3.

6 Continue along Harrow Lane then turn left opposite the Harrow Inn. Follow the steep zigzag climb into Steep village, passing the church and Bedales school on your left.

7 Turn right into Mill Lane continuing downhill with great views over to Ashford Hangers.Watch out for surface water at the bottom of this slope.

8 At the next junction, bear right, following signs to Liss and Hawkley.

9 At the next junction turn left towards Hawkley and continue uphill.

10 Continue straight on towards Newton Valence and Alton. After one mile pass the pond on your left.

 At the next junction continue straight on following signs for Newton Valence and Selborne.
Turn left for Priors Dean and Colemore. After Goleigh Farm, there is a steep downhill section, where the surface may be slippery. **13** At the t-junction in the woods turn right then go straight ahead at the next junction.

(4) At the next t-junction turn left.

**I**5 At the crossroads stop and cross carefully.

**16** Continue straight across the next crossroads towards Privett. Follow the road to Bower Farm and bear left.

17 At the t-junction turn right for Froxfield Green.You are now at the halfway point.

**18** At the next junction continue straight on to a steep downhill section to the busy A272.

IP At the A272 cross turning right then immediately left.

20 At the next t-junction turn right signposted East Meon and West Meon. Continue into East Meon.

**21** Turn left into Church Street following the road through East Meon village.

**22** Turn left towards Frogmore and continue over the bridge.

23 Turn left near to Oxenbourne House, towards Buriton and Ramsdean.

24 At the t-junction turn right, then left under the A3 signposted Petersfield and Buriton. Take the second exit at the roundabout, continuing over the bridge.

**25** At the crossroads in Buriton village turn left onto Petersfield Road.

26 At the t-junction turn right towards Petersfield and at the roundabout take the second exit towards the town centre.

27 In the cobbled area turn left into Hylton Road, then bear right onto The Spain. (For the town centre turn right from The Spain into Sheep Street, which brings you to The Square). Take the second left back to Petersfield station.
