ARRT works with farmers, landowners, regulators, policy makers, anglers, other recreational users, community groups, volunteers, business, academia and NGOs. By preparing funding applications, working in partnership, providing project management and offering advice and practical support ARRT promotes local action to maintain and enhance the rivers and water bodies within our catchment.

ARRT was launched on 15th June 2011 and was registered in England & Wales as a Company Limited by Guarantee on 18th November 2011, Company Registration No: 7853698. ARRT became a Charity by registering with the Charity Commission for England and Wales, entered on 28th May 2012 as Registered Charity No: 1147477.
