WINCHESTER CITY MILL, ONE OF THE NATIONAL TRUST'S MOST UNUSUAL HISTORIC BUILDINGS, IS NOW ALSO AN OFFICIAL GATEWAY TO THE SOUTH DOWNS NATIONAL PARK.



Set in the heart of England's ancient capital city, Winchester City Mill has a history dating back more than a thousand years and is one of just a few working urban corn mills left in the country. This summer a new exhibition tells the story of the mill, its produce and introduces people to the delights of walking, cycling and enjoying family days out in England's newest National Park.

As well as watching flour being made and then taking it home to bake with, visitors can discover more about the South Downs' special landscapes and wildlife, find ideas for locals walks and experiences – as well as how easy it can be to explore by trains, buses or bicycle.



National Parks Week 2015 runs from Monday 27 July to Sunday 2 August and is an opportunity to celebrate everything about the UK's family of 15 National Parks. This year the theme is 'Landscapes of Plenty' recognising that 'Britain's Breathing Places' are not only great places to explore and enjoy but also home of some of the best produce in the country.
