5. What is the aim of the strategy/project/policy/service?

The Joint Wealden Heaths Phase II Special Protection Area Supplementary Planning Document (SPA SPD) is to provide guidance to applicants where development proposals will result in a net increase in residential development within 400 metres of the Wealden Heaths Phase II Special Protection Area.

It sets out the approach that the Authority and East Hampshire District Council will take to help meet the needs for residential uses where the need cannot be met solely outside of the 400 metre buffer zone (specifically Gypsy, Traveller and Travelling Showpeople accommodation and rural affordable housing exception sites).

This stage of the process seeks views on the draft SPA SPD, which will help inform the final document adopted by both authorities.

The end users will primarily be Development Management Officers and also Planning Policy Officers. The desired outcome is that decisions regarding development allocations and planning applications can be taken to ensure that the affordable housing needs of rural communities and gypsies, travellers and travelling showpeople can be met, within the requirements of the Habitats Regulations Assessment work undertaken for the East Hampshire Joint Core Strategy and the Pre-Submission South Downs Local Plan, to avoid adverse effects on the integrity of the Wealden Heaths Phase II Special Protection Area.
