Archaeology on the edge	2018-19 to 2019-20	Not yet clear						The project is part of the National Trust HLF Changing Chalk bid and aims to address the imminent loss of important archaeological sites along the Heritage Coast cliffs and erosion of the beach at Cuckmere Haven. The project will be an assessment of current historic environment data and coastal erosion data, combined with new survey work, to identify sites under imminent threat from destruction. The results of the assessment will inform a follow up project to mitigate this loss through archaeological excavation and recording.

Over the five year period the projects aims to fully restore 6 ponds along the South Downs Way on or near chalk grassland sites.

This will move the species one step closer towards its BAP aspiration of having 10 viable populations nationally. The project involves monitoring the species in the most recent translocation sites and carrying out capital works to prepare the new site to receive a new colony.
