Title of Report (Decision)	Appointment of Deputy Chair(s) of Policy and Resources Committee

Recommendation: The Authority is recommended to:

- I. Agree, in accordance with the Authority's Standing Order 8.3, that the Policy and Resources Committee may appoint up to two Deputy Chairs of the Committee for the period up to the first meeting of the Committee following the Authority AGM in 2019; and
- 2. Agree that, within this period, a review be undertaken with regard to the number of deputy chairs for the Policy and Resources Committee and, if appropriate, a recommendation be made to the Authority in advance of, or at, the Authority AGM in 2019.

I. Introduction

- 1.1 At its meeting on 19 July 2018, the Policy and Resources Committee (P&RC) resolved to defer the appointment of a Deputy Chair until its November meeting and to recommend that the Authority determine that two Deputy Chairs may be appointed to the P&RC.
- 1.2 This report seeks approval from the NPA for the P&RC to appoint up to 2 Deputy Chairs and agree that the number of deputy chairs for the P&RC be reviewed and, if appropriate, a further decision be taken in relation to the number of deputy chairs for the committee in advance of, or at, the AGM in 2019.
- 1.3 The Committee has operated with two deputy chairs since its establishment in 2017. The Governance review, which resulted in the establishment of the committee, concluded that having two deputy chairs would help ensure that the responsibilities held by the then Governance Committee and Policy and Performance Committee were integrated into the work programme of the new committee.

2. Policy Context.

2.1 Deputy Chairs attend briefing meetings and provide input into the development of the committee's agenda and review draft papers and recommendations in advance of committee meetings. They also attend the informal Committee Chairs and SMT meetings.

3. Issues for consideration

3.1 The original rationale for the appointment of up to 2 deputy chairs was to take into account the wider remit of the P&RC than its two predecessor committees, which now covers the majority of the work of the Authority (outside of that which is the responsibility of the Planning Committee). There have been no significant changes to the remit of the committee over the last 12 months.

4. Options & cost implications

4.1 A review of members allowances, following the 2017 governance review did introduce a

small allowance for the position of deputy chair, however this would not take effect whilst there were two deputy chairs in post

5. Next steps

5.1 Depending upon the decision by the NPA, the P&RC will seek to appoint a Deputy Chair or Deputy Chairs at its November meeting.
