Autumn survey 2018 – in brief

Thank you to everyone who took part in our autumn survey, as always your responses are extremely useful. Below are a few early results and we'll include a more detailed update of how we're using them in our March newsletter.

- More than seventy per cent of you thought that the National Park Authority and our partners should **do more to promote health and wellbeing in the National Park** by including links on our website to walks and activities in the National Park (72%) and working directly with local communities to promote opportunities to enjoy it (72%)
- Less than one in ten of you (9%) **had attended an event** where you saw our events van, team or stand and seven in ten (70%) of you weren't aware of the events we attended. We clearly have work to do to raise the profile of these events and will ask these questions again next year to see how we're doing
- Those who had seen us at an event had good things to say. In particular the South Downs
 National Park map (93% strongly agreed/agreed that it was useful) and the expertise of our
 staff (88% of you strongly agreed/agreed that the staff were informative).

- More than one in ten of you (11%) were interested in **completing a John Muir Award** in the National Park. We've shared this information with our education and outreach team and will follow up with more information in a future newsletter
- Around a third of you (35%) were **interested in participating in a focus group or online community** to help inform our strategy for health and wellbeing. If this was you watch out for an email in the coming months with more information
- Less than a third of you (29%) had signed up to the South Downs National Park enewsletter and remained signed up.
