We think that's enough development for the lifetime of this local plan and perhaps the next.

Calm traffic speeds particularly through the settlements. Discourage 'on street' parking, dwellings providing sufficient on plot space. Manage surface water runoff and diffuse pollution into water courses. Development/redevelopment to install sustainable foul water treatment systems which discharge into running water courses or soakaways. Geological understanding of developments on clay soils which dominate our community, the effect of soil movements and increased surface water runoff from the new developments onto existing development with appropriate mitigation at the planning stage. Incorporate renewable energy processes which are sensitive to the landscape.  Max 100 words
