Farming is now part of Key Stages I and 2 within the National Curriculum, so the enhanced facilities will enable a greater number of visits to be safely delivered. As part of the project, the farm will work with LEAF (Linking Farming and Environment) to connect with more schools in the area and expand their educational visit offer.
